## Key Scripture and texts

Matthew 2:1-12 - The Visit of the Magi - 'They bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.'

Matthew 8:5-13 - 'Lord, I do not deserve to have you come under my roof. But just say the word, and my servant will be healed...'

Matthew 13:3-9 - The Parable of the Sower

## Key Vocabulary

Adoration - a feeling of deep love.



Epiphany - 'Epiphany' comes from the Greek word meaning 'to reveal', as it is when the baby Jesus was 'revealed' to the world.

Kingdom of God - the domain over which God reigns as King. This means any person who puts God first carries the Kingdom of God within them, as they go about helping the poor and sick.

Magi - the wise men in the Bible who followed a star to Bethlehem.



Miracle - an extraordinary event taken as a sign of the power of God.

Parable - a simple story which has a special religious or moral meaning at the end.
