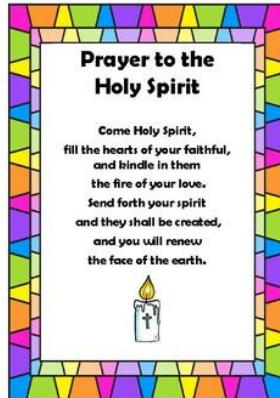

Key Vocabulary

Concluding rite - The Concluding Rites begin with the priest praying for God's **Blessing** upon us all. This is often done in a simple manner in the name of the Trinity. The focus of the Concluding Rites is to send us forth to carry out the mission, and our baptismal call, to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Discipleship - Discipleship is a word used to describe the faithful who are called to be witnesses of Christ to the world. Catholics are called by God to serve as his disciples in a variety of ways.

Emmaus - Emmaus is a town mentioned in the Gospel of Luke of the New Testament. Luke reports that Jesus appeared, after his death and resurrection, before two of his disciples while they were walking on the road to Emmaus.

Holy Spirit - the third person of the Trinity; God as spiritually active in the world.

Pentecost - Fifty days after Easter. The day the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles, causing them to speak in tongues.

St Paul - Saint Paul, was a Christian apostle who spread

Key Knowledge

- The Christian belief in the mystery of God as Trinity and some signs and symbols of the Holy Trinity (e.g., Jesus called the disciples to 'make disciples of all nations' in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- Christians make the sign of the cross as a prayerful reminder of their baptism through the Holy Spirit to be children of God and participants in the Christian community.
- Mary joins the disciples in prayer and Catholics can ask for Mary's prayers.
- The life of the early Church and Catholics gathering for Mass today.
- We learn about the life of Jesus in the gospels, the work of the disciples in the Acts and learn that Paul wrote letters to the early Christian communities, and these are different ways of writing.

Key Scripture and texts

Luke 24:13-35 - Road to Emmaus 'When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them'.

Matthew 28:16-20 - The mission to the world 'Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'.

Acts 1:12-14 - The group of apostles (Mary) 'They all joined together constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.'

Acts 2:42-47 - Early Church 'They broke bread in their homes and ate together'.
